

Message from the President

Greetings all! We hope everyone is staying safe and practicing social distancing. We have had an interesting end to the current ASHE Chesapeake year as unfortunately most of our events have needed to be cancelled due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic that has disrupted our nation. Although ASHE Chesapeake is dedicated to promoting professional and social events to connect transportation professionals, the risk of spreading the virus, as well as state and national closures and guidance have forced us to cancel all of ASHE's in-person events for the near future. For some of these events, such as the Golf Tournament, this makes holding the event untenable this year and we are planning steps to reschedule for next year. Other events such as the technical sessions may re-emerge as virtual events instead of in-person meetings. As all of us are adjusting to the new reality in our nation, we ask all ASHE members and supporters to be understanding of our needs to adjust events, and to provide us any feedback on what kind of events you would welcome from ASHE in the coming months.

The year started out well, with several successful ASHE events in the late winter. In February, we had another successful Water Resources meeting. Historically, it's been our best attended meeting, and this year's was equally popular, in no small part to the quality of the presentations. Laura Ridler from MDOT SHA presented a new approach to a flexible Erosion and Sediment Control sequence of construction, which generated much interest and a lively discussion during the Q&A session. Amanda Malcom from MDE PRD presented updates to MDE's internal organization under the Water and Science Administration, including Dam Safety's changing role and additional guidance on MDE Dam Safety Policy Memo #2. Hank Gottschalk from CP&P presented several insightful examples of proper and improper pipe installation, and new technologies the industry is using to inspect pipes post-construction for structural integrity and contract conformance. We'd again like to thank the technical presenters, as well as our dinner speaker Joel Oppenheimer, for giving us their time and for their enlightening topics.

ASHE Chesapeake kept engaging our members on smaller events through February and March. On February 4th, ASHE participated in the YPT event to support our fellow professional organization, with several of our younger members gaining valuable professional connections through both organizations. Next, we brought back the Poker Tournament on February 22nd after a few year's lapse. This year's event was highly entertaining and helps ASHE support our scholarship fund, as well as the local charity Athletes Serving Athletes. This year the event was won by Chris Bauernfeind, and although it was smaller than past events, the tournament was lively and engaging and we look to continue to promote the Poker Tournament in the coming years. Our last event of the year was our Younger Member's Axe Throwing night at Urban Axes. We have great younger members within ASHE Chesapeake as a whole, and also on our Board of Directors. Once again our younger members, led by Lauren Havener, organized a great event. Even though the effects of COVID-19 were already impacting our lives (plenty of hand sanitizer was available to all), I believe this was one of our best events of the year. Most of us were amateur throwers, but everyone learned quickly and it was a highly competitive and fun tournament. We'd like to thank the coaches, Riley and Cody with Urban Axes, who did a great job teaching us throwing techniques and keeping everyone safe.

Continuation of Message from the President

Unfortunately, safety has become a greater concern to all of us this spring. As already highlighted above, the COVID-19 pandemic and the closure of Maryland for non-essential businesses has severely curtailed ASHE's ability to continue our calendar of events throughout the spring and summer of this year. We have been forced to cancel our Highway technical meeting in March, Member Appreciation night in April, and the Golf Tournament in June. In addition, ASHE National was forced to cancel the National Conference in Raleigh this year and will be rescheduling to hold the National Conference in Raleigh in 2024. As the Chesapeake Board has been monitoring events within Maryland and the country, we are re-evaluating our traditional calendar of events and considering alternatives for the summer and fall of this year to try to continue to promote professional and social connections in the transportation industry throughout Maryland. We may promote a few virtual events as the country begins to open up in order to continue to promote social distancing. We will also look to schedule smaller in-person events which may be consistent with current safety guidelines being promoted across the state. One such event may be a Younger Member hiking event in late summer or early fall, if it can be organized to maintain everyone's safety. Again, I'd like to thank all of our members for your support and understanding.

Finally, I'd like to thank everyone, both members and non-members who have supported our organization over the past year, and have made my job as ASHE Chesapeake President as easy and engaging as possible. The ASHE Chesapeake February Water Resources Meeting featured three technical presentations. The first technical presentation was conducted Laura Ridler from Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA). Laura discussed SHA's updated Sequence of Construction (SOC) protocol, which calls for flexible rather than prescriptive SOCs. Flexible SOCs should focus on critical erosion and sediment control restrictions and procedures needed to meet compliance rather than detailing the order in which the contractor performs the proposed work.

The second technical presentation was presented by Amanda Malcolm from Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). This presentation was focused on MDE Policy Memorandum #2 – Roadway/Railway Embankments with Culvert Crossings. This presentation focused on roadway embankments that are either intentionally or unintentionally designed as dams. Amanda's presentation focused on the potential hazards that could result from impounded water upstream of roadway embankments as well as on MDE's updated design protocol for such situations.

The third technical presentation was presented by Hank Gottschalk from Concrete Pipe & Precast, LLC. This presentation was focused on the installation and inspection of precast concrete drainage pipes. During his presentation, Hank discussed common mistakes made during the installation of concrete pipe, as well as signs of failure that often go unnoticed during the inspection of existing pipes.
